# FUELING CHANGE WITH EVERY KILOMETRE

**Dirt n Dust Run**, in collaboration with **WA Rotary Relief**, has provided \$60,000 in seed funding for a new **Mental Health Disaster Aid Fund**. This initiative aims to support mental health in disaster-affected communities, ensuring long-term resilience and recovery.

WA Rotary Relief, has a strong track record in disaster relief across Western Australia. They respond to various disasters such as bushfires and cyclones, providing practical and mental health support. Some of their significant initiatives include:

### **Key Past Initiatives by WA Rotary Relief:**

- Wooroloo Bushfire (2021):
  - o 86 houses lost.
  - Provided 47 lockable and waterproof containers (\$214K), tool libraries (\$73K), and fencing support (~\$165K) in collaboration with BlazeAid.
- Cyclone Seroja (April 2021):
  - Severe damage in the Mid-West region with ongoing mental health challenges.
  - Supported mental health programs, such as the JK Rock Solid Leaders Program (~\$16K).
- February 2022 Fires:
  - Affected the agricultural heartland, impacting multiple properties.
  - Provided fencing materials (\$25K) and installed diesel generators in Katanning for emergencies (\$100K).
- 2023 Wooroloo Bushfire Follow-up:
  - Continued support for residents still impacted, including water tank repairs, shower/toilet repairs, and leach drain installation.
- 2024 Fires in Parkerville and Nanga Brook:
  - Assisted with lockable waterproof containers and skip bins for rubbish removal.

WA Rotary Relief's operational approach focuses on long-term recovery and community engagement, working closely with organisations like BlazeAid and the Minderoo Foundation. Their flexibility allows them to provide timely assistance that fills gaps left by traditional responders.

The new Mental Health Disaster Aid Fund aligns with Rotary's focus on both mental health support and practical aid. This fund will help to address the mental health challenges that arise during disaster recovery, continuing their legacy of compassionate and effective support. We are excited to see how this initiative will further contribute to building stronger, more resilient communities in times of need.











Dirt n Dust has provided \$18500 for **In Between the Ears**, an initiative created to raise awareness and offer support for individuals suffering from post-concussion syndrome (PCS) and traumatic brain injuries (TBI) specifically at local AFL level. Founded by Brendan and Chris, who have lived with ongoing post-concussion syndrome and mental health challenges, In Between the Ears was born out of their desire to help others navigate their recovery journey.

To date, In Between the Ears has been self-funded by Brendan and Chris while they continue working full-time. This has limited their ability to reach as many people as they would like. However, with a grant from the Dirt n Dust fundraiser, they have been able to provide direct and tangible assistance to ten PCS and TBI sufferers.

#### **Key Support Initiatives:**

## • Noise-Cancelling Headphones:

Phonophobia, or sensitivity to sound, is a common symptom among PCS/TBI sufferers. Everyday sounds can become unbearably loud, leading to overstimulation, anxiety, and even panic attacks. With the Dirt n Dust grant, In Between the Ears has been able to offer high-quality noise-cancelling headphones, such as the Sony WF-1000XM4 (in-ear) and Sony WH-1000XM5 (over-ear). These headphones aid in meditation and mindfulness, which are essential tools for concussion recovery and promoting mental well-being.

#### Referral System for Healthcare Support:

In Between the Ears has also established connections with local healthcare professionals to create a referral system. This network includes physiotherapists, psychiatrists, concussion-friendly GPs, and other specialists who can assist sufferers. With the funds provided by Dirt n Dust, In Between the Ears will now be able to alleviate some of the financial stress associated with initial medical appointments by covering the cost of the first visit, helping individuals take their first step toward recovery without the burden of financial pressure.

The ability to provide this support, from noise-cancelling headphones to financial relief, has been life-changing for many. For those who struggle with PCS and TBI, these simple yet meaningful tools can drastically improve their quality of life.
